

25 JAHRE MAUERFALL OR: HOW I LEARNED TO STOP WORRYING AND LOVE THE OSSIS/WESSIS

A performance project in multiple parts on the occasion of 25th anniversary of the Fall of the Berlin Wall | August - December 14 KICK-OFF: The Berlin Circle Audio Walk | SAT | August 9, 2014 | 1pm | Berliner Ensemble, main entrance



Ten years after the Fall of the Berlin Wall, noted US playwright and historian Charles Mee wrote Berlin Circle, which takes a decidedly satirical look at the end of East Germany and the western feeding frenzy that descended upon the former state property. The illustrious guests in this collage-like collection of spectacular events, including historical characters such as Erich Honecker and Heiner Müller, ponder whether a third possibility could be hidden when choosing between the old and the new using the same source material that inspired The Caucasian Chalk Circle.

Berlin Circle is the starting point of a contemporary examination of German Reunification during the performance project in multiple parts 25 Jahre Mauerfall or: How I Learned To Stop Worrying and Love the Ossis/Wessis.

English Theatre Berlin | International Performing Arts Center has invited two of **Berlin's most exciting theater companies** to use the text as the raw material for their own work. In doing so, the format of a **site-specific performance parcours** has emerged as the common denominator.

We Are the Play by SISYPHOS, DER FLUGELEFANT (SdF)

The **interactive performance** We Are the Play examines **the notion of "we" in Germany** from the Fall of the Berlin Wall to today from the viewpoint of **immigrants** on both sides of the wall. Documents and reports from **eyewitnesses** will be consolidated into an **act of playing** that will serve here as a method for **rediscovering** the past, **rethinking**, transformation and as a route **to each other in the here and now**. The impulse for this resulted from the stereotypical made-up language of a Chinese businessman in Mee's play: what if we could actually understand him? What would he have to say?

At Kottbusser Tor, people have been protesting rapidly rising rents for years. copy & waste will send the audience there for an **audio walk**, a journey into the Berlin Circle. Under the headphones you can hear what's going on in the current struggle as well: **the divvying up of the loot**. It's time to vehemently deny the claim that there hasn't been a war here in seventy years. Who's hunting who?

The Berlin Circle Audio Walk in collaboration with B_Tour Berlin

This binaural audio walk with original dialog through the real locations of *Berlin Circle* serves as the opening of the project – the Producing Artistic Director of ETB | IPAC, Daniel Brunet, will take the audience from the **Berliner Ensemble** to **Checkpoint Charlie** and the **Pergamon Museum**. Actors have been recorded performing dialog from Charles Mee's text at these locations that the audience will listen to via headphones, juxtaposed with the present reality of these sites. Commentary by the tour guide about today's Berlin accompanies all of this as a third level of time lapse.
