Young **Isaac Newton** desperately wants to become a member of the honorable British Academy of Sciences: the Royal Society. He conducts a peculiar self-experiment to win over the curator of experiments, **Robert Hooke**. By manipulating his eyeball with the help of a needle, he attempts to prove that light is made of particles and not, as Hooke surmises, of waves. 300 years later, it turns out they were both right.

With a strong foundation in scientific history, **Isaac's Eye** playfully mixes the facts of Newton's life and his research on the structure of light with an equal dose of fiction. In doing so, it explores what great people are willing to sacrifice in order to become great people.

As part of the series **SCIENCE & THEATRE**, Prof. Regine Hengge (Institute for Biology/Microbiology at Humboldt Universität Berlin) and advanced science students will serve as scientific advisers for the production.

LUCAS HNATH is one of the most promising voices in contemporary

US theater. His plays *Death Tax, NightNight, A Public Reading of an Unproduced Screenplay about the Death of Walt Disney* and *Red Speedo* have been produced by some of the most important art theaters in the United States, including Soho Rep in New York and the Studio Theatre in Washington. He is a current Resident Playwright at New Dramatists and has enjoyed residencies at the Royal Court in London and 24Seven Lab, New York. Hnath is a two-time winner of the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Grant for screenwriting. In 2014 he returns to the internationally renowned Humana Festival of New American Plays two years after his first invitation in 2012.

Lucas Hnath is part of the new generation of US playwrights like Annie Baker (*Circle Mirror Transformation*), Jackie Sibblies Drury (*We Are Proud to Present...*) or Thomas Bradshaw (*Southern Promises*) whose work quite successfully takes the classic naturalistic play and expands it into new formats that are currently critically discussed in Great Britain and the United States.

THE TRE

SCIENCE & THEATRE is a transdisciplinary cooperative project at the interface between science and art. In doing so, the academic training of scientists is connected with the production of *science plays* and the communication of science through theater in a completely new way.

Productions dealing with *Science & Theatre* have been produced at English Theatre Berlin | International Performing Arts Center under the artistic direction of Günther Grosser in collaboration Prof. Regine Hengge and advanced science students since 2010. Following an initial seminar at the university, scientists and science students work with the director, dramaturg and actors to prepare the production.
