A Space Drama | A Science Fiction Tale

Valentina, a cosmonaut from Bulgaria and Fritz, an astronaut from West Germany, were launched into space thirty years ago at the height of the Cold War. Forgotten by their governments, they are now the sole inhabitants of a dysfunctional space station stuck on a decaying orbit around the planet Earth.

The International Space Station's principle of changing missions and staff has been applied by post theater to their project. Stuck in Orbit features two separate missions: The mission Leave for Good features Patrick Khatami and Mareile Metzner and is directed by Daniel Brunet. The mission One Thousand Years features Christoph Schüchner and Mareile Metzner and is directed by Max Schumacher.

Post-performance discussions will be offered on May 11 and May 16.
