The Tenth EXPO Festival:

A Showcase of Wahlberliner*innen

Festival | Anniversary Edition February 15 – 29, 2024

Celebrating Berlin's international independent performing arts community! Over the last ten years, the Expo has been able to present more than one hundred performances of new work and work new to Berlin by international artists who have made Berlin their adopted home. In doing so, it holds a unique position in Berlin's vast cultural landscape as **both** a **local and international festival**. Berlin's **Freie Szene**, **the independent performing arts community**, is remarkable for its diversity of background, artistic and aesthetic practices, working methods and philosophies. One of the Expo's most important goals is to ensure that this is reflected in the performances that make up the festival.

Nearly 200 artists and groups based in Berlin applied to take part in the festival this year and receive a production budget. The interdisciplinary curatorial team of Daniel Brunet, Christin Eckart and Maque Pereyra have put together a schedule of programming based on the criteria of artistic quality, internationalism and creative diversity. Between Febraury 15 amd 29, 2024, the anniversary editino of the festival will present twelve different productions from the fields of dance, theater and performance, six of which as part of the newcomer's platform ExpLoRE, where new talents, shorter works and current projects are presented as works-in-progress.

Amongst other highlights, the festival program includes world premieres by Jemima Foxtrot and Chōri Collective, Alexander Cameltoe & The Mannequins, Sami Giron Dance and Yael Esther Mor, an impressive performance by Roman Škadra (German premiere) from the world of contemporary circus and five dance productions by André Uerba, Masha Sapizhak, Duos Duet (Niki Yaghmaee & Golsana Shenasaei), Frida Giulia Franceschini and Sami Giron Dance.

The annual Expo Festival: A Showcase of Wahlberliner*innen took place for the first time in 2013.

Daniel Brunet is a director, performer, producer and translator.

He was born in Syracuse, New York in 1979 and received a BA in theater arts and film studies from Boston College. He moved to Berlin in 2001 with the support of a Fulbright Scholarship. Brunet became Producing Artistic Director of English Theatre Berlin | International Performing Arts Center in 2012 and established an artistic concept there that mirrors his own work: English as a working language, used by non-native speakers and native speakers alike in bilingual or multilingual works exploring sociopolitical topics. Daniel Brunet has received multiple awards for his over thirty play translations, including the Literary Fellowship in Translation from the U.S. National Endowment of the Arts. He was a guest director and

instructor for German drama at the New School University in New York City in 2017. Brunet has served as the speaker for the performing arts within the Speakers' Circle of the Coalition of the Independent Arts and as a co-opted board member of LAFT – Landesverband freie darstellende Künste Berlin e.V. since the end of 2018.



Christin Eckart is a director, culture worker, theater scholar and linguist. During and after her studies at the Free University of Berlin and Université d'Orléans she worked on numerous productions as a director and production manager at the Orphteater. After spending ten years abroad working linguistics and in alternative lifestyles, she returned to Berlin in 2018 as an instructor, translator and freelance writer. She has coordinated the

Information Center of the Berlin Performing Arts Program (PAP) since 2019 and is responsible for its Mentoring Program. She supports artists in beginning to work as freelancers. Alongside her work as an adviser and instructor, she also currently works as a curator, production manager and freelance writer.



Maque Pereyra is a multidisciplinary artist, psychologist and pleasure/spiritual activist based in Berlin. In 2018 she finished the MA SoDA program at HZT. A DAAD scholarship in the field of performing arts was granted to her from 2016 until 2018. In her home country, Bolivia, she obtained a BA degree in Psychology in 2014. Her artistic work (performances, videos, workshops) has received awards and been presented internationally on platforms such as Tanztage Berlin, Tanzquartier Wien and HKW. The focus of her work is on healing, empowerment through pleasure and spiritual activism, decolonial/artistic aesthetics-

ExpLoRE: Cynthia

A one-drag-king-one-puppet play by **Alexander Cameltoe & The Mannequins** | World Premiere

February 19, 2024 | 8pm

Cynthia was a model, an influencer, a socialite, a celebrity and a household name

in the USA in 1933. But unlike other celebrities of her day, she got dismantled into pieces at the end of her day and stowed away in a body bag. Cynthia was a mannequin. Her creator, Lester Gaba, a window display designer in New York City, became her manager, puppeteer, and chaperone, taking her to dinner clubs, theater premieres and fashion shows, and performing for her and answering for her to her adoring fans. Let this duet between Berlin drag king Alexander Cameltoe as Lester Gaba and a puppet version of himself as Cynthia, take you down the slippery slope from entertaining spectacle into the uncanny valley. The play will be then performed at House of Yes in New York City in April.

A man dressed in a glam style manipulates twenty iron kettlebells. Dealing with the awkwardness forces his body into a new shape with every

movement. This results in a fragile, ever-expanding composition implying effort and collapse. The piece challenges the historically hyper-masculine aura around the kettlebell and seeks an alternative poetics of labor.

Tricks For Gold is a fable set in late capitalism in which the protagonist, a magician, discovers that she can become the object of her desires - money - and tries to transform herself into it.

A performance by Yael Esther Mor | World Premiere

This is a mockumentary performance and a film. A diary and a fable. Yael is an artist who has immigrated to Berlin. She's broke, tired of babysitting, and afraid her big dreams won't be fulfilled. She gets an

opportunity for a week's residency, but the night before it starts a sinister character appears in her nightmare, planting a seed of self-doubt that gets bigger and bigger, making her residency a living hell while she is losing grip on reality.

How does your body feel today? In this time of velocity and violence,

choreographer and performer André Uerba explores intimacy as a practice of being together, along with seven performers and a musician. This work plays with the boundaries between sharing and withdrawing, movement and stillness, vulnerability and exposure.

The performers structure their encounter through a slow pace, propelling their bodies to attune, sink and merge together, refining their present moment. The desire to make hidden things visible is unfolded by their intimate gestures. Collectively they turn their gaze to inner landscapes where slowness and touch become a main practice.
